ERASMUS POLICY STATEMENT

Erasmus Policy Statement

The University of Security in Poznan considers international cooperation an important factor enhancing the quality of its research and teaching activities. The University is engaged in the Erasmus program since 2008 and it fully intends to enhance its involvement in coming years.

Our main objective is to educate graduates equipped with theoretical knowledge and practical skills making them competent employees sought after on the job market. In order to prepare graduates for functioning in modern European community we try to expose the greatest possible number of students to European experience through increasing student and staff mobility and extending the offer of courses taught in foreign languages.

The University of Security cooperates with institutions and businesses in the region trying to negotiate internship placements for students. Through its increasing participation in international educational and research programs it is becoming a truly European university.

In order to give visibility to Erasmus activities, this Erasmus Policy Statement accepted by the University's authorities is published on the University's website: www.wsb.net.pl.

The content of this Statement, together with the Erasmus University Charter is distributed and implemented by all faculties. Both documents are published in information materials and presented at regular information sessions targeted at various groups of recipients: students, coordinators and staff. The information on current actions and activities is disseminated among the University's community using e-marketing and traditional marketing technics including, but not limited to, publication on the University's website, Facebook and Twitter accounts, mass mailing, posters, leaflets.

The University's authorities will ensure an easy access to information and Erasmus activities for all interested students and staff, prevent discrimination and encourage and support disadvantaged candidates and participants.

The University's Internationalization Strategy aims to promote longer-term partnerships with universities and other organizations in research, teaching and enterprise for mutual benefit.

Key objectives:

- to raise the University's international profile through recruitment and partnerships;
- to internationalize the curriculum to reflect an increasingly diverse student and staff body;

- to expand the number of programs offering an international experience;
- to engage actively in the Bologna process and Life-Long Learning activities.
- developing own institutional strategies for sustainable development and combining them with the concepts of mobility and internationalization.
- implementing The Erasmus Without Paper Network policy, through participation in the virtual Erasmus network and development of electronic tools to support students, lecturers and the entire university Erasmus administration

Faculty and departmental ECTS coordinators are responsible for academic preparation of outgoing students. Partner institutions are selected on the basis of the program offer so that program discrepancies can be as minimal as possible. ECTS system is used at all faculties as a tool of accumulation and transfer of results obtained outside the home institution.

The University helps all incoming students to find accommodation. All of them take part in Orientation Days, during which they are assisted by the University's Erasmus Coordinator and local Polish students. Local student organizations are invited regularly to participate in integration events and assist incoming students during their Erasmus stay.

Satisfaction of outgoing and incoming students is checked through questionnaires after their completing study period.

The University promotes and supports Erasmus teaching activities. Periods completed in host institutions are acknowledged in regular staff evaluation. General preparation and language learning of mobile students and staff are supported and facilitated.
